The Children's Hospital at Wesmead	Funeral Information Booklet for families supported by the Palliative Care Service at The Children's Hospital at Westmead.	We would like to develop a Funeral Booklet for families to assist with funeral preparation following the death of a child. It will provide a practical approach/guideline for planning during this time. This includes: Care of the body after death Arranging a funeral (including funeral costs) Key considerations when contacting funeral directors Options for financial support (charities, Centrelink) The booklet will be available to families of the palliative care team at the Children's Hospital at Westmead. Likewise we aim to buy and distribute new car seats to welfare agencies, to ensure babies and children are not being put at risk by financially disadvantaged parents using unsafe and out of date car seats. Canley Heights Public School	Canley Heights Healthy Start Program	For many of the students at Canley Heights Public School, being provided at least 3 meals a day is quite rare due to their family's socio-economic status. This is impacting greatly on their ability to concentrate in the classroom. We have recognised that some of these students are being sent to school without having eaten since lunch on the previous day, posing significant malnutrition and attendance risks. We wish to combat this issue by offering breakfast to these students before school three mornings a week in our school hall, where they can enjoy a healthy and regular meal.	<b>\$10,000.00</b>
Fairfield City Council	Stay and Play Together 2016	This extension of a very successful, previously funded project, will offer the services of a multidisciplinary-therapy team to children with disabilities/developmental delays, through attendance at playgroup sessions. Families will access speech-pathologists, special-educators and OTs to develop individual family-support plans and therapy in a familiar, playbased environment, at no cost. It is well documented that what happens in children's early-years has consequences for life. Quality environments at the right stage are crucial in shaping developmental outcomes. With Stay and Play Together-2016, families' capacities will be strengthened by learning strategies that will improve their disabled children's developmental outcomes and quality of life.	<b>\$13,200.00</b>
